## Study visit to Lund Sweden (28 Oct -02 Nov 2019)

The Librarian and Library Assistant attended a study visit to the Raoul Wallenberg Institute (RWI) in Lund, Sweden. It was a joint activity that also included court librarians from the ECOWAS Community Court of Justice and the East African Court of Justice.



Organised by RWIs regional Africa Programme the overall objective was a demonstrable improvement in access to justice for all and improvement of human rights commitments in Africa.

The specific objectives of the study visit were to;

- 1. Train the Librarians in modern library operations especially digital access.
- 2. Enhance peer learning and exchange.
- 3. Networking and bridge-building.

# Study visit to MICT Library (18 Oct 2019)
